Executive Directors Note



It's Bean Fun!

It's BEAN an exciting year for Bean Around Books! This year, we've had over **20 volunteers** gaining work experience and life skills, with 11 of them from SD42 and 12 who heard about our work experience opportunities. New this year, **Foundry has partnered with us**, bringing youth who want to gain work experience here at Bean Around Books. We continue to spread the word within our community, participating in events like Garibaldi Dungeons and Dragons, the Garibaldi Winter Market, serving coffee and tea, and presenting at SD42 WorkBC sessions to inform youth about our Pathfinders program.



We've maintained our collaboration with the **Life After School Transition (LAST)** committee, holding monthly meetings to inform other organizations about our programs and brainstorm on how we can reach more people. Additionally, Bean Around Books hosts parents' information nights once a month for drop-ins, providing support for parents struggling to find programs for their kids.

What do you get when you combine three ladies playing canasta and a father-daughter writing dual? Without fail, every Tuesday, this group of five makes their way to the cafe. You won't even know it until it's over, but you will likely become a part of this group's vortex of conversations. And if you don't, I would bet you would be listening and smiling. If you work here, you better be ready to be bossed around: 'MORE TEA, PLEASE!' 'HEY!!! THAT BOOK IS IN THE WRONG SPOT!!!' 'YOU FORGOT MY SUGAR!' Over the last four years, the Employment Beginnings Program has served **389 youth** between the ages of 16 to 30 experiencing barriers to employment and representative of our diverse Canadian society. Following the program, **262 youth have found permanent employment** or gone on to educational opportunities. **32 youth are currently still in the program.**

The achievement of these impressive statistics relies on remarkable companies aligning with a shared vision, committed to giving back, and fostering a mutually beneficial scenario for both parties.

This month, we celebrate our newest community partner, **Comfort Keepers**, based out of White Rock, B.C. What sets Rag Rack apart is its altruistic purpose — all proceeds generated from the sales contribute directly to funding the mentorship program for youth with cognitive and intellectual disabilities. This youth-led and operated initiative welcomes year-round donations of gently used clothing, emphasizing community engagement and sustainable practices.
